The 14 August 2023 meeting of the Falls City Mustang Club was called to order by President Steve Merritt at the New Albany American Legion. Steve welcomed everyone to the meeting that was being held two days earlier than usual due to planned travel by a number of club members. Marty Clegg, Sec/Treasurer, reported on the club finances along with distributing a copy of the treasurer's report to everyone. Marty also reported that a donation of \$1200 had been sent to the Honor Flight Bluegrass. That amount will fund two veterans for a trip to Washington, DC to visit their respective war memorials. Scott McGloshen handed out copies of his and Chris Moorman's monthly edition of 'Mustang News and Stuff'. This monthly edition showed the Mustang is sold in 111 countries around the world. Factoring in population, 72 % of all people in the world can buy a Mustang. Also the Mustang has been honored with a US postage stamp twice, in 1999 and 2013. Kamos Glover, Road Boss, gave out travel info for the annual trek to Somerset on August 25. Kamos also announced that Kevin and Susie Liebert were an award winner at their first MCA judged show recently in Indianapolis. In other news the August Cars and Coffee had a good showing at the Charlestown Creamery and Coffee. Chris Moorman reported on the recent NSRA gathering at the Kentucky Fairgrounds. Steve spoke about a group of FCMC members going to the Dearborn Woodward Dream Cruise this coming weekend. The Hoosier Mustang Club will host their annual All Ford Fall Festival car show on September 23 and the Derby City Mustang Club hosts their annual Fordfest on October 14 at Bill Collins Ford. On August 27 a car show at the Charlestown Square will be held to benefit a local fellow injured on the job. The FCMC members voted to donate half of the first quarter donation to help this individual. The other half will be donated to the Happy Home Furniture Bank to help local families get furniture they need. Steve has been in contact with Oak Street Health regarding the FCMC being involved in a cruise in at the Youngstown Shopping Center in Jeffersonville. The October 20 outing will be a trunk or treat event. Mason Broughton is working on a Thanksgiving food giveaway that the FCMC could possibly be involved in. In regard to club officer positions, Steve made it official that Kevin Liebert will hold the Website Development position, something he has been doing for quite some time. Steve also recommended and members approved that Kamos Glover be the sole MCA Regional Director rather than it being a shared position. Dining prior to the September meeting will be at Marks Feed Store on Charlestown Road. On the monthly drawings, a free oil change at Jim O'Neal Ford was won by Phil Steinmetz and the cash drawing, which by the way was up to \$75, was won by Glenn Reis who graciously donated the entire amount back to the club. Being no further business the meeting was adjourned.
