Ford Breaks General Motors' Infamous Recall Record

Ford has issued 89 recalls in the first six months of 2025. That number surpasses the annual record for recalls by an individual manufacturer. Ford's 89 records so far in 2025 surpassed the 2014 record held by General Motors, when the latter issued 77 recalls.

'Game On:' Ford CEO Responds to the Corvette's Nürburgring Record

The Corvette ZR1X dethroned the Ford Mustang GTD as the fastest American car at the 'Ring. Ford's CEO isn't being quiet about it.

The Mustang GTD has 815 horsepower, which is a lot, but the ZR1 makes 1,064 hp, and the ZR1X ups it to 1,250 hp. Power and weight figures aren't everything, but they do count for a ton. .

The 2026 Ford Mustang adds an FX package that was inspired by the third-generation car from the 1980s and '90s. Also known as the Fox body, it was available with white wheels like those that come with the new appearance package, along with other exclusive bits.

The FX package is available on the Mustang's GT Premium trim. The FX package can be paired with the coupe or convertible body style.

Every FX-equipped Mustang has white wheels, and these specific rollers are included on cars with the GT Performance pack. Every Mustang GT Premium features a 480-plus-hp 5.0-liter V-8 and the choice of a manual or automatic transmission. The car pictured here is wearing the new Adriatic Blue Metallic, which is similar to the teal hue offered on the Fox bodies. The FX package includes seats with plaid inserts, another throwback details inspired by the Fox bodies. The Mustang GT emblem on the passenger-side of the dash features the same font as the old-school cars. The 5.0 badge on the front fenders is outlined in white to match the wheels.

Just inside the doors of the employee entrance to Ford Motor Co.'s Dearborn Truck Plant is a scoreboard that looms high above a double set of steep stairs that carry the 3,600 employees up to the factory floor where the company builds its best-selling vehicle: the F-150 pickup.

Ford slaps a green smiley face with the word "winning" over the metrics the workforce got right that day, or it puts a red frowny face with the word "losing" on it, for areas where they fell short.
