2026 Hawthorne Glenn Cruise-in

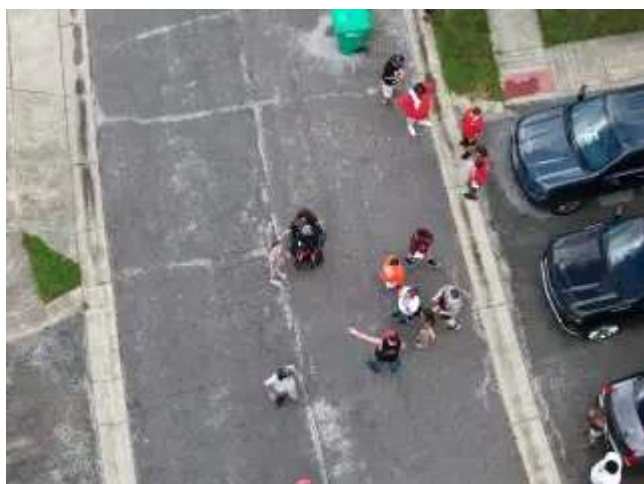

Ford recalls more than 110,000 Mustang vehicles over windshield wiper, drivetrain defects:

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), the automaker is recalling 110,626 vehicles in two separate actions affecting certain Mustang, Mustang GTD and Mustang Mach-E models.

The larger recall affects 67,842 Mustang and Mustang GTD vehicles. NHTSA said that under certain cold-weather conditions, the windshield wipers may operate only at the high-speed setting, while the windshield washer system may not function properly. The agency said the reduced visibility could increase the risk of a crash.

In a separate recall, Ford is recalling 42,784 Mustang Mach-E vehicles because the rear differential pinion shaft may fracture. According to NHTSA, the defect could result in a loss of drive power or unintended vehicle movement if the SUV is parked without the parking brake applied, increasing the risk of a crash.

Ford Mustang Named America's Top 'Gateway' Car For Enthusiasts:

In terms of which specific model turned folks into automotive enthusiasts, the number one answer was the Ford Mustang - in fact, the pony car was the number one gateway vehicle in every generation surveyed here, from Baby Boomers up to Gen Z.

The Ford Mustang left a sizable gap on the second place Chevy Camaro, too - it garnered more than three times as many votes as that defunct rival - followed by the Honda Civic/CRX, Chevy Corvette, Toyota Supra, Pontiac Firebird, Porsche 911, Nissan Skyline/GT-R, Mazda Miata, and Mazda RX-7 rounding out the top 10.

Enthusiasts find styling ranked first, as one might imagine, followed by speed/power, the way they drive, cool factor, engine sound, and nostalgia.
